Information

The Information, Referral & Support Program is based in our Yellowknife office. It is available to all residents of the NWT who have an enquiry related to disabilities.

This is a cross disability, non - age specific program. A formal diagnosis is not required in order to access services.

Our Coordinator is available to provide information related to disabilities to all Territorial Residents. This can include assisting a person to locate appropriate resources regarding a specific disability, providing information about Territorial and Federal programs related to disabilities or information regarding other organizations or programs that may be able to assist.
