Accessible Parking Permit Program



What is Accessible Parking?

- Accessible parking allows extra space for wheelchairs, crutches, and other mobility aids.
- Accessible parking is usually located close to the entry of a building.
- Communities, businesses, schools, and stores may assign special parking places for people with mobility aids.
- Accessible parking is marked



What is an Accessible Parking Permit?

The Council issues permits in the form of a hangable permit. With an accessible parking permit you can park in accessible parking spaces. If you

How Do I get a Permit?

Parking permits may be permanent or temporary. Applications are available from our office or on our website www.nwtdc.net

You complete page one of the application, and get a Doctor or Nurse Practitioner to describe your disability and sign the form. They will determine if you require a temporary or permanent permit. A Community Health Nurse may sign the form in communities where there is no doctor.

Who Can Get a Permit?

People with a permanent disability who use a mobility aid such as a wheelchair or walker to move.

People who can't walk 100 meters because they have a permanent or temporary disability.

Where and How Long Can I Use Accessible Parking?

- Hang the permit on the rear view mirror of any vehicle you use or travel in. The permit belongs to you, not the vehicle.
- Try to use accessible parking stalls for no more than 2 hours at a time.
- If you do not need the parking on a "good" day then you should leave the space for someone else.
- NWT Permits are recognized across Canada. You can use your permit when you travel

You can get a fine if you use accessible parking and you don't have a permit displayed.

Your permit can be withdrawn if it is used by someone else.
